## **Learning and Living the Bible Together**

## Living the Christian Life Lesson #2

What does it mean to live as a Christian? The Bible shows me people that are passionate for God (David, Abraham, Joseph, Daniel, Paul, Peter, John, etc.). How can I live for Him like that? I want to live the life for which God made me.

- 1. The Christian life only occurs from a sure salvation that is only through Christ. (Review)
  - -> A Christian is made <u>new</u> by Christ. There should be <u>real change</u> occurring in the life of a follower of Christ. True living starts with a new birth only caused by God. We must be careful not to substitute religion, church, respect from others for real salvation.
  - -> A Christian should <u>pursue</u> the life they have been made for in Christ (Phill. 1:21; Mark 12:30; 2 Cor. 4:16-5:9; Phil. 2:12)
    - Followers of Christ <u>hunger</u> for God and the things of God (Phil. 3:10-11; John 14:21)

The Second Question we must ask is regarding our understanding of God's call on our life.

- 2. The Christian life is a completely <u>different</u> lifestyle than the world around us.
  - > One of our real traps is that we want Christianity <u>and</u> the world's values.
  - a) the Christian life is uncompromising and unconditional <u>abandonment</u> of self and full surrender to God (Luke 9:57-62, 14:25-35; Mark 10:21; Matt. 13:44)
    - > What hinders us from living this way?
      - \* living like the church around us and not pursuing Scripture's definition of a Christian

Examples: Halfhearted pursuit of Him is OK; being a churchgoer but not passionate for Him, lack of love for Word, good citizen in church and community is enough

- \* never fully living the Christian life as giving all to Him and willing to do anything He wants us to do
  - we twist the Jesus of the Bible into a message and image that is more comfortable to us

- we are OK with obedience within limits (let's don't go crazy with obedience and look really weird)
- —> A Christian "counts the cost" and <u>pursues</u> God's will each day. This results in God being a priority above everything (family, work, our selfish desires, etc.).
- -> A Christian gives their life to Him without <u>qualifications</u> or boundaries. A Christian lives with full and <u>exclusive devotion</u> to God.
