## **Learning and Living the Bible Together**

## Living the Christian Life Lesson #3

What does it mean to live as a Christian? The Bible shows me people that are passionate for God (David, Abraham, Joseph, Daniel, Paul, Peter, John, etc.). How can I live for Him like that? I want to live the life for which God made me.

- 1. The Christian life only occurs from a <u>sure salvation</u> that is only through Christ.
  - -> A Christian is made <u>new</u> by Christ. There should be <u>real change</u> occurring in the life of a follower of Christ. True living starts with a new birth only caused by God. We must be careful not to substitute religion, church, respect from others for real salvation.
  - -> A Christian should <u>pursue</u> the life they have been made for in Christ (Phill. 1:21; Mark 12:30; 2 Cor. 4:16-5:9; Phil. 2:12)
- 2. The Christian life is a completely different lifestyle than the world around us.
  - -> A Christian "counts the cost" and <u>pursues</u> God's will each day. This results in God being a priority above everything (family, work, our selfish desires, etc.).
  - —> A Christian gives their life to Him without <u>qualifications</u> or boundaries. A Christian lives with full and exclusive devotion to God.

The Third Question for us is a question of focus, purpose, and priority. What is a primary goal we must have?

- 3. The Christian life is focused on the Gospel.
  - a) the <u>advancement</u> of the Gospel is a <u>priority</u> (Matt. 28:19-20; Acts 1:8, 2:38-41, 4:20, 4:33, 5:42, 8:4-5; Phil. 1:5, 7, 12, 16-18, 27; 1 Peter 2:9)
    - > What hinders us from focusing on the Gospel?
      - \* we accept a <u>church "norm"</u> that we can exclude the Gospel from everyday living instead of looking at commands from Scripture
      - \* sharing the Gospel is not seen as an <u>essential</u> part of a Christian life (Mark 8:34-35)
      - \* fear of people
      - \* fail to see lostness and eternal destiny of the world around us (2 These. 1:8-9)

- \* fail to recognize we are <u>directed by our Lord</u> to share the Gospel (1 Thess. 2:4)
  - has not been role modeled within the church
  - sharing of the Gospel is not really emphasized
  - not willing to give our life for this purpose
- b) joy, <u>excitement</u>, and gratitude overflow from our life due to our salvation by God's grace (1 Tim. 1:12-17; 1 Peter 1:1-3; Eph. 2:1-10)
  - > Why would we not be excited about sharing and telling of Gospel?

Not a real salvation, taking salvation for granted, lives dulled by glitter of the world

What happens in Scripture that we can apply to us?

- \* it is part of our <u>everyday conversation</u> due to our joy and excitement. It is not necessarily a planned event.
- \* you truly recognize you have been <u>rescued</u> from God's wrath (1 Thess. 1:10)
- \* you fully realize salvation was a gift to you (Eph. 2:8-9)
- —> A Christian is <u>excited and thankful</u> for the work of God's grace in their life. They are fully aware they are saved by His work and His work alone. A Christian recognizes they were headed for hell and eternal separation from God without God reaching down and rescuing them.
- -> A Christian is focused on seeing the Gospel <u>advance</u> around the world. This means a Christian shares their faith, supports work that advances the Kingdom, and yearns to see people come to know Him.
