Learning and Living the Bible Together Romans 5

- 1. We have great <u>assurance</u> and wonderful results from salvation by grace through faith. (5:1-11)
 - a) The one saved by God has peace with God. (5:1)
 - The wrath of God is now satisfied.
 - God fully <u>accepts</u> the one saved by grace and has given <u>access</u> to God. (5:2)
 - b) The one saved by God stands in His grace and is always covered by His grace. (5:2)
 - The Christian has <u>security</u>. Grace is not a one time event. We STAND in His grace! Our salvation is permanent, firm, and immovable.
 - c)The one saved by God should have <u>JOY</u> due to: (5:2, 3, 11)
 - Our future of being in the <u>presence</u> of God and His glory. (5:2)

NOTE: Our past is shown in v. 1, our present shown in v.2, and not we see the future!! Justification has given us heaven, a place in the presence of God and in His glory!

- God at work within us to grow and <u>mature</u> us in Christ. (5:3-4; Rom. 8:29; Phill 1:6)
 God says "I saved you. You are mine. I will change you and make you all you were made to be in Christ."
 - * Trials are <u>certain</u> and used for our development. (2 Tim. 3:12; James 1:2; 2 Cor. 4:8-11)
 - * Our hope and <u>eternal focus</u> grows. (5:4-5; 2 Cor. 4:16-18) We have hope to more hope and this hope is sure.
- d) The one saved by God has the <u>love</u> of God abundantly given to them. (5:5)
 - The Spirit of God is given to us and is a constant reminder to us of His love. (5:5)
 - Christ died for us while helpless and ungodly. (5:6-8)
- e) The one saved by God is saved from the wrath of God through Christ. (5:9)
- f) The one saved by God is <u>saved forever</u> by the living, risen Savior! We are free from the permanent penalty of sin. God has saved us and keeps us in salvation throughout our earthly life. (5:10)

- g) The one saved by God is <u>JOYFUL</u> in God as we realize we have been reconciled to God forever!!
- Realize all you have in Jesus. You have been rescued and delivered from condemnation by God! You did NOTHING and received full acceptance into the family of God.
- > Does my life reflect this security, this hope, this promise?
- 2. We have a great Savior that is victorious over sin and death. (5:12-21)
 - a) Sin and death came to mankind through Adam. (5:12-14)
 - b) <u>Sin</u> entered through one man. <u>Salvation</u> comes through one man. (5:14-21)
 - <u>Judgment</u> occurred from one sin that impacted many. Justification came from one to cover the sins of many. (5:15)
 - * one sin brought judgment. We see the <u>seriousness</u> of sin. (vv. 12, 15-18)
 - <u>Justification</u> through Jesus is always <u>greater</u> than any sin and it's effects. (5:15, 17, 20)
 - c) Sin only offers death. Salvation through Jesus only results in <u>life</u>. (5:16-17)
 - d) Sin only offers condemnation. Salvation through Jesus only offers justification. (5:18)
 - Jesus' one act on the cross completely paid for our sin.
 - e) Sin is everywhere and in mankind BUT **GRACE ABOUNDS** even more!! **JESUS**, Lord of all is always sufficient!! (5:20-21)
 - Sin results in death. Grace results in life.
 - Salvation is a gift from God. Salvation is completely a result of the grace of God. (5:15-17)
 - > JESUS IS ALWAYS SUFFICIENT! Sin is terrible but our Savior is GREATER!
