Learning and Living the Bible Together Romans 12:1-2

1. "Therefore"

- We have a great Savior and a great salvation. (Romans 1-11)
- We have a wonderful, awesome God who has showered us with grace.
 - * We now move into the discussion of practical Christian living; i.e., the practice of the Gospel and the impact of the Gospel on the life of the person saved by grace.

2. "I urge you, brethren"

- We are strongly encouraged to respond to Him and His gracious work in us.

3. "by the mercies of God"

- We deserve judgment resulting in <u>hell</u> but through His grace have been given a relationship with God and a home in <u>heaven</u>.

4. "to present your bodies"

- We must willingly offer our Body to Him for His use.
- Why the body? The body is the instrument of service to Him. It reveals our action.
 - * our actions, our full body, and it's use are to be fully <u>yielded</u> to Him
 - * sin resides in our body and so our body must be continually yielded to Him

5. "a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God"

- We must realize that <u>acceptable</u> worship is presenting ourselves fully to God. We must address disobedience in our lives. (1 Sam. 15:22; Psalm 51:17)
- Jesus offers the only dead (temporarily) sacrifice necessary for the Christian life but we are to present our living sacrifice (our lives) to Him.
- We must offer to Him our lives, hopes, dreams, <u>our everything</u> to truly live. Examples are Abraham offering Isaac on the altar, Paul's declaration in Phil. 1:21.
- We must submit to Him for His special <u>purpose</u> for us and giving Him our <u>best</u>. This call is not a half-hearted offering nor is it offering Him "seconds".

6. "which is your spiritual service of worship."

Worship is the only <u>reasonable response</u> to God. Worship is giving all to Him.
 (John 4:23; 1 Peter 2:5,9; Heb. 13:15-16; Mark 12:30) Our heart should be, "I'll go anywhere, give everything, do anything, I am yours!"

7. "And do not be conformed to this world"

- > Our BIG Issue our area of <u>conflict</u>. This speaks to our mind. In previous chapters, we have looked at the soul. In v.1, we reference the body. Now we look at the mind, where we make choices.
- > Conform made into something you are not. We put on a false appearance. We have been made new yet we conform toward something we are not in Him.
- Don't let the world around you squeeze you into its own mould J.B. Phillips
- We are not to have an outward expression patterned after this world Wuest
- We must guard against adopting the world's values, goals, and focus.
- We need to be careful not to apply this verse with <u>legalistic rules</u>. This is a matter of our heart and our pursuits.

8. "but be transformed by the renewing of your mind"

- We are to change to reflect our inner, redeemed nature.
- The change occurs as we let God change us. (2 Col. 3:18; Rom. 8:28-30)
- We must have our mind changed and that change is through the Word and the Spirit. (Psalm. 119:11; Eph. 5:15-18; Col. 3:2; 2 Tim. 3:16-17; 2 Pet. 3:17-18)

9. "so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."

- As we submit, our will begins to align with His will. We begin to do His will.
- Through Him changing you, you will experience Him and reflect Him to all around you.
- This change process from worship of Him is an everyday process.
