## Learning and Living the Bible Together Job 2

## A. The Second Conversation between God and the devil (2:1-6)

- 1. God's awareness of Job's commitment and suffering
  - the devil is our adversary
  - God is saying Adversary, I permitted you to attack him. In spite of this test, your accusations are worthless. Job still holds fast to his integrity.
- 2. God's allowance of further harm to Job but with restrictions.
- 3. The Adversary
  - he stands ready to accuse, attack, and bring us to rebellion

## B. The Additional Catastrophe encountered by Job (2:7-8)

(Note the scope and severity of the affliction. Note the full scope of what he has encountered and where he now sits.)

- C. The second declaration of Commitment to God (2:9-10)
  - 1. His wife's discouragement and hopelessness
  - 2. Job's declaration of devotion to God regardless of circumstance
- D. The Comfort offered by his friends (2:11-13)

## **Application to us: (Chapter 2)**

- 1. God looks at our heart and our integrity, not our possessions, position, etc.
  - even though Job's earthly situation has drastically changed from the beginning of chapter 1 to the beginning of chapter 2, God still sees him the same (He notes his integrity)
- 2. Be on guard against the adversary. (Eph. 6:10-18)

- 3. God is in control. He will not allow us to be tempted beyond what we can handle (1 Cor. 10:13). He puts limits on what he allows the devil to do.
- 4. We are to trust God because of who God is and not because of circumstance. Commitment is not an outcome of circumstance.
- 5. In times of grief or trial, be a minister to others:
  - Be the spiritual leader in your home even in the toughest of times. (Job was)
  - Recognize family and friends may grieve differently than you do.
  - Be a friend that sticks closer than a brother. (Prov. 18:24)
  - Keep the focus on worship of God and trust in God.
- 6. We do not have "rights" to anything. God can do what He wants. (Psalm 115:3; 135:6)
